Theme 'Year of Justice for Africans and People of African Descent Through Reparations'

It is timely and powerful that the theme for Africa Day 2025 is 'Year of Justice for Africans and People of African Descent Through Reparations'. At the PJ Patterson Institute for Africa Caribbean Advocacy, we stand in full support of this call. The Institute urges all former colonial powers to acknowledge their role in centuries of exploitation and to repair the wrongs from systemic disregard of bodily autonomy, land, rights, and the dissolution of culture through chattel enslavement and colonialism. Without a doubt, the people of Africa and the African diaspora have had their land, consciousness, and bodies brutalised by these systems of oppression.

We recognise that righting these historical wrongs cannot be satiated just by renunciations and self-reproachful statements without concrete actions of restitution. Reparations must be pursued through structural change and material redress — through policies and programmes that heal the generational damage inflicted on African and diasporic communities. In calling for reparations, we are calling not just for justice, but for a future built on mutual respect, shared purpose, and the unbreakable bonds of African identity. Together, we reclaim our story and shape a new chapter rooted in dignity, truth, and transformation.
